At Bryce Canyon, she took on the "I Hiked the Hoodoos" challenge and received a sticker from the gift shop after completing it: "The Hoodoos challenge is where you hike several of the trails in Bryce Canyon and find these certain benchmarks and either take a photo of yourself at it or make a rubbing of it on paper to show proof at the visitor center of what trails you did. To qualify you needed three trails. The three trails we did were the Peekaboo Loop, Wall of Windows and Navajo Loop. In total it was a 3 mile (4.8 km) hike at close to 8,000 elevation and in 100 degree heat!"
